







Napkin Ghosts



What you will need:

- White Napkins
- Cotton Wool
- String or wool
- Black marker

Optional Extras:

- Glue stick
- Googly eyes,
- Foam shapes,
- Wool, feathers, fabric,
- Fancy paper



Napkin Ghosts



1. Take a white napkin and open it out.
2. Lift up from central point.
3. Roll a fluffy piece of cotton wool into a ball or use cotton balls.
4. Tuck the ball of cotton wool into the inside 'pinch' of the napkin.
5. Shape the 'ghosts head', you can experiment with the head shape making it different sizes and varying shape
6. Twist the neck
7. Tie the string around the neck in a firm knot (see tip). Leave a long length so that you can hang the ghost.
8. Make two black dots for the eyes.
9. Hang your napkin ghost and enjoy!

TIP: Tying a knot, ideal age 6+

Some children do not know how to tie knots. A once distinguished milestone in child development has fallen by the way side with the introduction of Velcro.

Allow them to get use to handling the wool. Slowly describe to them what you are doing. Use descriptive words or make a rhythm or story to give them visual clues and help them remember what to do next.

Teach them to cross over, loop under and like a rabbit pop through the top – tighten to the horizon, the ends greet each other, wrap around and pull apart tight.

Use the **optional extras** to collage the Ghost's body, eyes, feet. Sit back and let the kids play make ghost families and add gruesome details.

Further creative fun: Ask your kids to think about if the ghost has a character? How can they show the character? Hair, wire glasses made from flower arranging wire, feathers or patterns on the napkin... Have fun experimenting.
